## (I) The deadline for submitting applications is 30 June 2025.

The assessment criteria will be:

- Clarity and structure of the argument (i.e. relevant and well-organised arguments) 30%
- Quality of oral delivery (i.e. clear diction and appropriate tone) 20%
- Relevance and originality of the speech (i.e. ability to nuance the debate, to capture interest and stimulate reflection, use of examples to support arguments) 50%

The 3 best candidates selected will be notified as soon as possible after the deadline and all travel and accommodation expenses will be arranged and paid for by the Council of Europe.
